


Courier Deadline

Frustrated with God

Whether it stems from something you want but don't have, something or someone you lost, something you believe you deserve, or something you simply don't understand, most people find themselves angry or frustrated with God at some time in their lives. When the trials are long and intense, even a mature believer can be frustrated over God seemingly not doing anything. Proverbs says "Hope deferred makes the heart sick, but a longing fulfilled is a tree of life" (Prov. 13:12). In between God's promise and the manifestation of it, is the battering of our thoughts and heart. What we are experiencing clashes with the truth of God's Word and our faith. Sometimes our frustration is of our own making, sometimes it is the work of Satan. Sometimes we concentrate on the wrong, temporal things, as Jonah did. Sometimes we lash out because we think God didn't warn us like He should have of what was ahead. However, many times it is our problem, since we rush headlong into situations without thinking through the consequences. Many times the problem is with our limited view. We accuse the Lord of not understanding, or not acting when we don't see the whole picture ourselves. We can forget such scriptural wisdom as Ecclesiastes 3:1: "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven." What doesn't make sense to us does not mean it is without reason. And, of course we always want good "seasons" in our lives, never bad, but if we live long enough, we will all experience gains and losses, joy and sorrow, love and grief. The seasons remind us that life is temporal and our emphasis should be on God, not us.
